MEETING MINUTES - OCTOBER 2024

Pasco CTST - October 23, 2024

Meeting started at 1:36 pm

I. Welcome and Introductions were made.

II. Meeting Dedication

Tina Russo (Pasco MPO): Tina Russo, from Pasco MPO, dedicated the meeting to two pedestrian fatalities which recently occurred on SR 52 at Moon Lake Road. SR 52 at Moon Lake Road is part of the Safety Action Plan. Tina stated that this location is near a travel park. There is no lighting at this signalized intersection and the next nearest signal is approximately one mile away. Discussion followed.

III. Minutes Approved

August minutes were approved.

IV. Old Business

- 1. **US 19 and Bay Boulevard** Eric Henry, from FDOT, stated that he would follow up with traffic operations regarding this.
- 2. US 301 and Chancey Road Eric Henry will confirm if the project is completed. Discussion followed.
- 3. Daughtery Road and US 301 No update.
- **4. SR 52 from east of Colony Road to Moon Lake Road** Eric Henry stated that a signal is proposed but there is not a funding source currently.
- **5. Wire Road** There is a CIP project for the sidewalk with the County. Tina Russo stated that she will look at the approved CIPs and see what is on there. *Wire Road can be removed from the problem locations sheet.*
- **6. Little Road at Heritage Lakes Boulevard:** This was resolved. *Little Road at Heritage Lakes Boulevard can be removed from the problem locations sheet.*

V. New Business

Education

Brentin Mosher (USF CUTR): The social media campaign on US 19 and Bartelt Road on the midblock pedestrian signal (MPS) is finished. Brentin discussed that the signage needs to be fixed at this location, including adding right lane must turn right signs, etc. Discussion followed.

Tina Russo (Pasco MPO): There are two more midblock pedestrian signals (MPS) set for construction within the next year, including an MPS at US 19 and Elizabeth Avenue, and a MPS on US 19 at San Marco Drive. There are plans to have six or seven midblock pedestrian signals installed on US 19.

Tina Russo (Pasco MPO): Tina discussed the Carfit program and how it helps fit aging drivers into their vehicles properly. Aging road user fatalities have been high. The Carfit program helps with senior mobility, and it allows the conversation to be discussed to be started about roadway safety. Tina stated that there

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are challenges to have Carfit participation due to seniors being afraid that their license will be removed from them. It is also difficult for the Carfit program to get into senior programs. There will be a virtual Carfit program option to try to increase participation.

Eric Henry (FDOT): The Carfit program has trained technicians and event coordination. FDOT is trying to plan Carfit training in Pasco County and Hernando County soon.

Enforcement

Jim Reiser (LEL): The pedestrian safety grant is up and running through the Institute of Police Technology and Management (IPTM) and the University of North Florida (UNF). Port Richey received the speeding and aggressive driving grant, and they are currently going through the internal approval process. Jim Reiser, from LEL, also discussed field training for officers on sobriety training starting back up in the future.

Brentin Mosher (USF CUTR): The Enhanced Law Enforcement Engagement (ELEE) program is still going on, but the hurricane caused some redirection of law enforcement officers. There have not been as many submissions recently. The ELEE program is giving points to officers who do the Train the Trainer's Impact Teen Driving Program in schools. But the hurricane caused disruption in class schedules.

Venkat Vattikuti (Pasco County): The ordinance was finalized for speed enforcement cameras in school zones. Discussion followed.

Engineering

Tina Russo (Pasco MPO): Pasco MPO will bring their Safety Action Plan to the board in November. They are currently working with a consultant on this. The scope of the work includes a micromobility study with three camera test sites for near miss crashes. These sites include Starkey Road at SR 54, Suncoast Trail at Ridge Road, and US 19 at Sea Ranch Drive. Venkat stated that US 19 at Sea Ranch Drive has video detection which can get pedestrian counts.

Crash Statistics

Lori Palaio (JMT): Lori Palaio discussed the fatal crash map. From January 1st to August 3rd, 2024, there were 65 fatal crashes. At the last CTST from January 1st to June 12th, 2024, there were 46 fatal crashes. The 19 new fatal crashes include one unknown, one rear end, three head on, two off roads, four other, two left turns, and six pedestrian fatal crashes.

For the six new pedestrian fatal crashes:

The first pedestrian fatal crash (Report Number 26284107) occurred on 9715 Brookdale Drive, not at the intersection, in day, clear, and dry conditions.

The second pedestrian fatal crash (Report Number 26360358) occurred on I-75 NB at mile marker 293.7 and Blanton Road, not at the intersection, in day, clear, and dry conditions.

The third pedestrian fatal crash (Report Number 26361330) occurred on SR 54 and Highland Loop, not at the intersection, in dark-lighted, clear, and dry conditions.

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The fourth pedestrian fatal crash (Report Number 26530701) occurred on US 19 and Gulf Drive, at the four-way intersection, in dark-lighted, clear, and dry conditions.

The fifth pedestrian fatal crash (Report Number 26388110): occurred on US 19 and SR 52, not at the intersection, in dark-lighted, clear, and dry conditions

The sixth pedestrian fatal crash (Report Number 2635912) occurred on Bruce B. Downs Boulevard and SR 56, not at the intersection, in dark-lighted, clear, and dry conditions.

There are 65 fatal crashes through August 3rd, 2024. During the same period in 2023, there were 55 fatal crashes, so Pasco County is up by 10 fatal crashes in the same period.

Jim Reiser (LEL): Jim discussed that the time change coming up will cause crashes. Discussion followed on education with the time change.

VI. Calendar Updates / Activity Reports

Brian Michaels (Pasco MPO BPAC): Pedestrian Safety Month is in October. He discussed that Pasco County sent out 275 newsletters with "Stop for Pedestrians" messages. The tax collector's office is also sending out safety messages. Lastly, the FDOT newsletter that came out recently also had a section in the newsletter about pedestrian safety.

Eric Henry (FDOT): A lot of safety events planned for October were canceled due to the storm; however, the holiday season is approaching and there will be impaired driving/DUI campaigns.

Jim Reiser (LEL): There will also be a Halloween Campaign, as well as the campaigns during Christmas, including Drive Sober Get Pulled Over. The MADD Candlelight Vigil will be held in December at Mission Hill Church in Temple Terrace.

There are a lot of left turn crashes from people traveling eastbound on SR 52 heading north onto the side roads. There are people from the side roads attempting to turn left to go eastbound on SR 52. Pasco MPO reached out to their liaison to see if the FDOT safety team was aware of this and if they were looking at it. Eric Henry believes there is a 3R that is coming through that portion of SR 52, and he believes there is a signal proposed. He believes they are still deciding where the final location is and whether they have funding to put the signal in. He is thinking they are looking to do some access management improvements through a few of those intersections in that segment of SR 52. It is Colony Road, Shadow Ridge Boulevard, and Sugar Creek Boulevard. Those three intersections in that half mile segment have a lot of crashes. There is no lighting on that section of SR 52. There is a signal at Moon Lake Road, but there is not another signal until you get way further west. The speeds are high along the segment. However, FDOT is not expecting these requests to fade at since there is a proactive need for enhanced visibility, especially with the continuous Shared-Use Path/sidewalk along both sides of SR 56.
