- Data Source
 - Signal Four Analytics (S4) database – crashes
 - UF, Bureau of Economic and Business Research - populations
- Data Quality

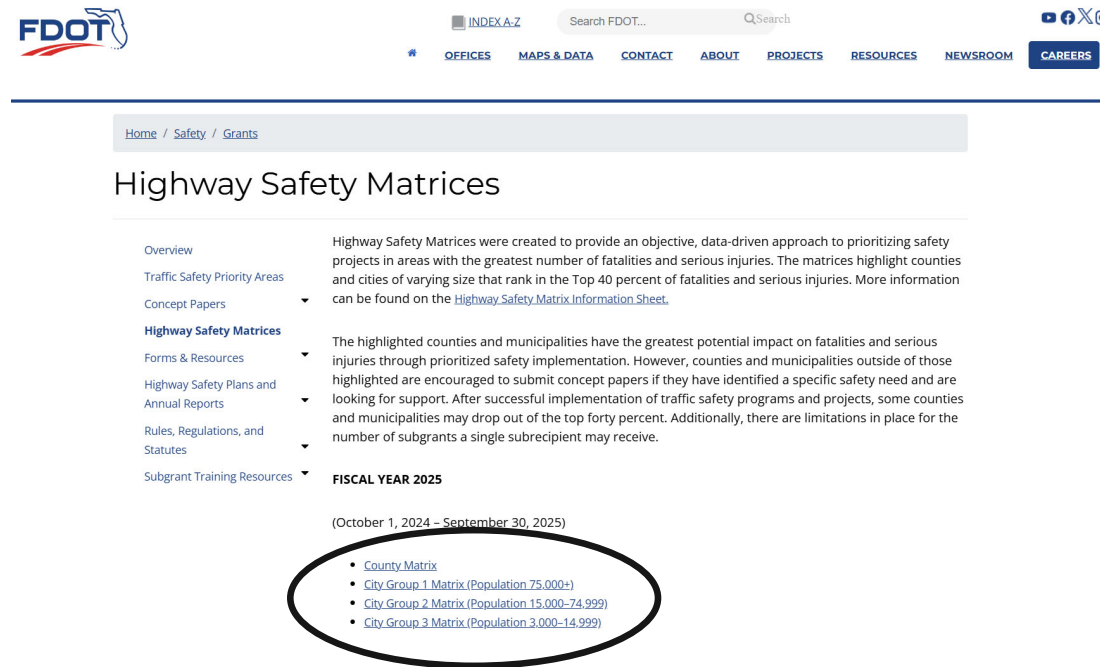

After successful implementation of traffic safety programs and projects, some counties and municipalities may drop out of the top forty percent. Additionally, there are limitations in place for the number of subgrants a single subrecipient may receive.
